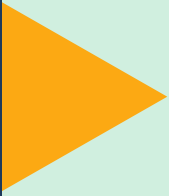

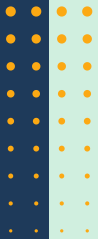

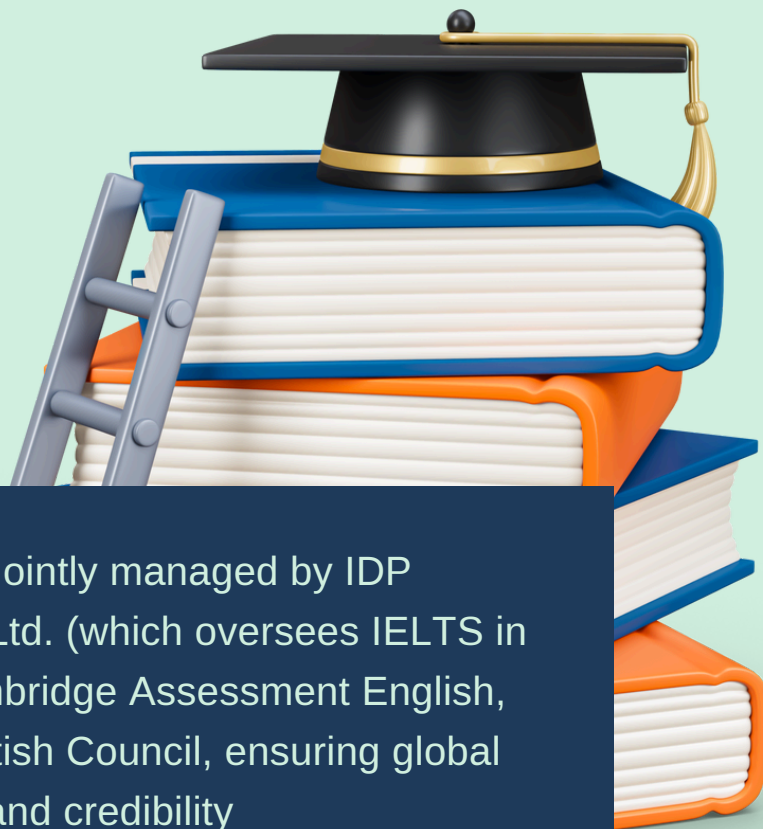

The test is jointly managed by IDP Education Ltd. (which oversees IELTS in India), Cambridge Assessment English, and the British Council, ensuring global standards and credibility

IELTS stands for International English Language Testing System, a globally recognised exam trusted by over 11,500 organisations across more than 140 countries. It's designed to measure how well you can understand, speak, read, and write in English; your grammar skills and your ability to communicate effectively in real-life situations, whether in academic settings, workplaces, or everyday life.

Eligibility Criteria

→ Minimum Educational Qualification

The test is open to everyone. Whether you have completed school or not, you can register and sit for the test.

→ Age Limit

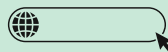
You need to be 16 years or older to register. While younger candidates can technically apply, it's generally not advised due to the exam's complexity. You can take the IELTS exam whenever you're ready, as long as you meet the basic eligibility.

→ Identification

A valid passport is mandatory for both the registration process and exam day, so keep that handy.

IELTS Syllabus

LISTENING

The IELTS Listening test lasts 30 minutes and includes 40 questions based on four audio recordings. These range from everyday conversations to academic lectures.

You'll hear speakers with different English accents, reflecting real-world situations. The recordings grow more complex, testing how well you follow ideas, details, and opinions under time pressure.

Question types include multiple choice, matching, and completion tasks—designed to check both your understanding and attention to detail.

READING

The Reading section runs for 60 minutes with 40 questions. It tests your ability to understand, interpret, and analyse written texts.

If you're taking the Academic IELTS, expect three long passages from journals or educational content, often formal and analytical in tone.

The texts for general training are more practical: workplace documents, advertisements, and articles from magazines or newspapers.

You'll tackle multiple question types like True/False/Not Given, matching headings, and sentence completion.

IELTS Syllabus

WRITING

In the Writing section, you'll complete two tasks in 60 minutes—both designed to test your ability to structure ideas clearly.

In the Academic test, Task 1 asks you to summarise visual data, while Task 2 requires an essay on an issue or opinion.

The General Training version swaps the visual summary with a letter-writing task, ranging from formal to informal styles.

You'll be scored on grammar, vocabulary, coherence, and task completion, so it's not just what you write, but how well you present it.

SPEAKING

The Speaking test is a 1-on-1 interview, lasting 11 to 14 minutes. It's recorded and divided into three parts.

Part 1 is a warm-up: you'll answer basic questions about yourself, like your home, hobbies, or studies.

In Part 2, you'll receive a cue card and speak on the topic for up to 2 minutes, after 1 minute of prep time.

Part 3 dives deeper into that topic, with more abstract or opinion-based questions to test your fluency and communication skills.

IELTS Results

Computer-delivered test: Results are available within 2 to 5 days after the test date.

Paper-based test: Results are released 13 days after the exam.

You can view your IELTS test score by logging into the official IDP IELTS portal. Use the same email ID and password you used during registration.

You can also access your results through several other channels like SMS, email, or directly from the test centre.

You will receive your IELTS TRF 3 to 5 days after the test date for Computer-delivered IELTS and 13 days after the test date after Paper-based IELTS

Personal Test Report Form includes Band scores for all 4 sections, overall band score and an equal weightage for each section

You can send your Institutional TRF directly to up to five universities/ institutions for free. These reports are issued in the institutional format.
